Integrated Family Violence Services

Sector and Community

inTouch's Sector and Community unit leads the transformation of family violence responses, utilising insights from migrant and refugee women's lived experiences to address the specific needs of social services, the family violence sector, and multicultural communities- building organisational capacity through diverse engagement initiatives.

Projects

inTouch partners with a variety of national and statebased organisations to build family violence recognition and response capacity through needs and placebased projects.

inSpire

Since 2018, the inSpire initiative has been working to fill post-crisis support gaps for migrant and refugee women engaging with inTouch's case management service. inSpire addresses the financial, cultural, social and institutional barriers that migrant and refugee women can encounter when recovering from family violence.

Recovery Groups

inTouch's community recovery groups provide a space for empowerment, fostering healthy relationships, and enhancing understanding of the impact of family violence, while also building social networks and increasing access to services.

Learning and Development

inTouch's Learning and Development team provides culturally responsive professional development for organisations to enhance participants' understanding of family violence, fostering their capacity to provide accessible and effective services to migrant and refugee communities.

Motivation for Change

Motivation for Change (MFC) works with men from diverse cultural backgrounds who have used violence against family members. Operating as an early intervention program, MFC offers individualised case management and multilingual, bicultural group work.

Legal Centre

inTouch's Legal Centre was established in 2012 to address the barriers faced by migrant and refugee women in accessing the justice and migration system. Services encompass areas such as protection from family violence, family law, immigration and visa assistance.
